This research focuses on Lanjiefu, a significant Han folk cultural activity in Wenzhou with a history of nearly a thousand years. The importance lies in its status as an important part of Zhejiang Province's intangible cultural heritage and its core values of harmonious coexistence, respect for heaven and ancestors, and humanistic care, along with multiple social functions. The research adopts a cultural heritage protection and inheritance approach. There are no specific respondents mentioned. The scope covers the evolution, values, functions, challenges, and solutions related to Lanjiefu culture. The methodology involves analyzing the historical development and current situation of Lanjiefu, and exploring the impact of digital technologies. serious concerns about the seamless intergenerational transmission of this ancient custom,

potentially leading to cultural discontinuity.

In this context, the present study assumes critical and timely importance. It aims to meticulously

analyze the challenge of preserving and perpetuating Lanjiefu culture within the digital age. The

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primary objective is to delineate feasible strategies that skillfully integrate the enduring core values and traditions of Lanjiefu with the innovative capabilities of digital technologies. By doing so, the research seeks not only to halt the decline but also to facilitate the sustainable development and continuous rejuvenation of this invaluable cultural heritage. Thus, this study serves as a beacon of hope, striving to ensure that Lanjiefu remains a dynamic and cherished cultural entity, bridging the past and future, and engaging the hearts and minds of generations to come.

1.2 Research background

Lanjiefu, a traditional folk activity carrying rich historical and cultural information, originated in Wenzhou during the Southern Song Dynasty, with a history of nearly 1,000 years. According to historical records, Lanjiefu was initially a folk ritual of praying for Lanjiefu in response to the frequent occurrence of plague at that time, and people believed that by sacrificing to the God of Heaven, they could drive away evils and avoid calamities, and bless the party with peace and security. With the changes of the times, Lanjiefu gradually transcended the original religious colours and incorporated more cultural elements and social functions (Chen, 2011).

During the Ming and Qing dynasties, Lanjiefu activities began to adopt a more structured scale and process. Every year, on the 15th day of the first month of the Lunar Calendar, around the time of the Lantern Festival, grand Lanjiefu celebrations were held in Wenzhou. The streets were adorned with lanterns, every house hung lanterns and placed offerings, and rituals were conducted to welcome the gods, praying for favorable weather and a bountiful harvest in the coming year. By the end of the Qing Dynasty and the early Republic of China, the influence of Lanjiefu expanded further. It not only attracted participants from neighboring areas but also became an important platform for showcasing local characteristics and fostering cultural exchanges.

After the founding of New China, Lanjiefu activities were interrupted for various reasons. However, following the reform and opening-up period, with the state's increased focus on intangible cultural heritage and enhanced protection efforts, Lanjiefu was revitalized. In recent years, Lanjiefu has been designated as a national intangible cultural heritage, and governments along with social organizations at all levels have invested significant resources to support its inheritance and development. Secondly, honouring the gods and ancestors is the spiritual pillar of Lanjiefu culture. Finally, humanistic care is the social responsibility of Lanjiefu culture. During the activity, both the care for the disadvantaged groups and the participation in public affairs highlight the humanistic spirit and social responsibility of Lanjiefu culture (Junqiang, 2008).

The social function of Lanjiefu is reflected in multiple aspects. First, cultural heritage: through the organization of Lanjiefu activities, the excellent traditional culture of the Chinese nation is preserved and promoted, enhancing national pride and cultural confidence. Second, community cohesion: Lanjiefu activities provide a platform for interaction and exchange among community members, strengthening community cohesion and fostering a sense of belonging. Third, economic development: Lanjiefu activities attract a significant number of tourists, thereby promoting the growth of local tourism and related industries, which positively impacts the local economy.

Fourth, educational significance: Lanjiefu activities, with their diverse performances and displays, not only enrich people's cultural lives but also hold significant educational value. For young people in particular, they offer an effective way to understand and learn about traditional culture.

Lanjiefu culture is not only a cultural card of Wenzhou and even Zhejiang, but also an important part of the excellent traditional Chinese culture. It not only carries deep historical memory and cultural value, but also plays an irreplaceable role in modern society, contributing to the construction of a harmonious society and the promotion of cultural diversity (Jianmin, 2010). The preparation and implementation of traditional Lanjiefu activities is a complex and delicate process, involving many links and many participants (Chen, 2011). Preparation work includes fundraising, venue set-up, programme planning, procurement of materials and publicity and promotion, each of which needs to be carefully arranged to ensure the event runs smoothly.

On the day of the event, the whole neighbourhood will be decorated with red lanterns and colourful flags on both sides of the street, and a variety of offerings will be placed in front of every house, creating a strong festive atmosphere (Qiang, 2001). At the beginning of the event, there is a solemn worship ceremony, in which people express their deepest respect and gratitude to the gods of heaven and earth and their ancestors. Afterward, a series of folk performances and games are staged, including dragon and lion dances, opera singing, and acrobatic shows, attracting a large audience who stop to watch. The scene is filled with laughter and joy.

Lanjiefu has a far-reaching cultural impact, which is not only the inheritance and promotion of traditional culture, but also a concentrated expression of community spirit and local characteristics. Through the activity, the connection between community members is deepened, strengthening community cohesion. Additionally, it provides foreign tourists with an opportunity

to learn more about local cultural traditions and folk customs, thereby promoting cultural exchange and dissemination.

The Lanjiefu event also had a positive impact on the local economy (Li-fan, 2010). During the event, a large number of tourists come in, driving the development of related industries such as catering, accommodation and tourist souvenirs, creating considerable economic benefits for the local community. At the same time, the event also provides local craftsmen with opportunities to display and sell their works, which helps protect and pass on traditional crafts.
